THE MOST REVEREND SAMUEL PRITCHARD MATHE-
SON, D.D., Lord Archbishop of Ruperts Land and Metropolitan of
Ruperts Land. Born in Kildonan, Manitoba, 1852. Educated at St.
John's College School and St. John's College, Winnipeg. B.D., 1875, St.
John's College, Winnipeg. Honorary Degree: D.D. 1901, University of
Manitoba. Ordained Deacon 1875, Priest 1876. Consecrated First
Bishop Coadjutor of Ruperts Land in Holy Trinity Church, Winnipeg,
on Sunday, 15th November, 1903 by the Most Reverend R. Machray,
D.D., Lord Archbishop of Ruperts Land, assisted by the Lord Bishops
of Qu'Appelle, Keewatin and Calgary. On the death of Archbishop
Machray in 1904, became Third Bishop of Ruperts Land. Elected Lord
Archbishop and Metropolitan of Ruperts Land in 1905. Residence,
"Bishop's Court," Winnipeg, Manitoba. Official signature, "S. P.
Ruperts Land".

tario, 1853. Educated at Trinity College School, Port Hope, and Trinity
University, Toronto. B.A. 1874, M.A. 1883. Honorary Degrees:
D.C.L. 1891, D.D. 1904, Trinity University, Toronto. Ordained Deacon
1881, Priest 1884. Consecrated Sixth Bishop of Nova Scotia in Christ
Church Cathedral, Montreal, on the Feast of St. Luke the Evangelist
(18th of October), 1904, by the Most Reverend W. B. Bond, D.D., Lord
Archbishop of Montreal, assisted by the Lord Archbishop of Ruperts
Land and the Lord Bishops of Toronto, Quebec, Algoma, Ontario, Mont-
real and the Bishop of the Philippine Islands. Residence, "Bishop's
Lodge," Halifax, N.S. Official signature, "Clare L. Nova Scotia."
