embrace all those common to a temperate and rather humid climate, the snowdrop, as in England, heralds the spring, and the succession of summer flowers are much the same, all hardy and semi-hardy annuals doing well and few of the well known shrubs and trees are never winter killed nor need any protection. Bird life is similar to that found in all parts of Northern America, and wild animals of any kind are practically unknown with the exception of a few deer from the timbered lands adjacent to the district.
