farmers do not like that proposition why should we deal with the United States on that basis. The United States says to Canada, "You can only sell to us over a 60% tariff wall," and Canada meekly replies to the lited States, "You may sell to us over tariff wall." Net loss to Canada every ye '-\$200,000,000 to \$300,000,000.

That is a lot of money, and you, Mr. Reader, can get some of that money every year if you will make up your mind to turn out every government that comes into power that continues to give our farmers and work people the same rotten deal that they are getting to-day, and the Prosperity League of Canada undertakes to watch every government that is in power, or comes into power, and we shall tell you whether you are cetting a fair deal or a rotten deal. We have the figures and facts, and we'll keep you posted.

If we protect farm products alone, there will be no one for our farmers to sell to. We must protect everybody — farmers, industries and work people, if we want everyone to have someone to sell to. What we want is broad coo-operation between all classes and all districts, and to stop Uncle Sam bleeding this country of about \$1,000,000 every day, as he has been doing. Counting interest and t: 4e together, the bleeding amounts to more than that.

There is no profit in producing unless you have a market for your produce. The policy of this country has been to bring as many farmers' competitors to Canada as possible and very little has been done to protect the industries and their workers who are the farmers' customers. Our farmers are barred out of the U.S. and if we do not build up our towns and cities with industries who are the farmers to seil to?
