And requesting that the House will take the same into Consideration, and grant such Allowances for the same, as they shall think just and reasonable.

And the fame was read,

Refolved, that so soon as Colonel Shaw, shall produce to this House Resolution thereon. proper Vouchers for the Sums paid by him before this Time, to the Militia, and for Provisions, Fire, Candles, Wood and Ammunition supplied, that the House will then take the same into Consideration for Payment thereof.

against his Majesty and Government, and for the Tryal of such Offenders.

An Act for continuing the several Acts relating to the Duty on Wheel-Carriages within the Penninsula of Halifax.

An Act for the making perpetual an Act, made in the 11th Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intitled, an Act to avoid the double Payment of Debts.

An Act in Amendment of an Act, made in the 2d Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intitled, An Act for the better regulating the Militia on actual Service in Time of War.
