A Message from the House of Assembly, by Mr. McNeill:

“Mr. President,

“The House of Assembly have passed a Bill intituled “An act to alter and repeal an act made and passed in the thirty-first year of the reign of his late Majesty, intituled an act for providing Pounds in the several Royalties in this Province”—to which they pray the concurrence of His Majesty’s Council.”

The Messenger then withdrew.

On motion, the said Bill received a first reading.

On motion, the said Bill was read a second time, and ordered to be committed.

The House thereupon resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, to take into consideration the bill intituled “An act to alter and repeal an act made and passed in the thirty-first year of the reign of his late Majesty, intituled an act for providing Pounds in the several Royalties in this Province”—and after some time spent therein, the President reported, that the Committee had gone through the said Bill, and had agreed to the same with, amendments.

On motion, it was ordered, that the Report of the Committee be accepted.
