SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST

LAND REGULATIONS. THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a net sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land he Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may he made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency) on certain conditious.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader muy live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along-side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per

Duties—Six mouths' residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his home-tead right may take a purchased home-tead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per icre. Dutles—Must reside six months in ach of three years, cultivate 50 acres and rect a house worth \$300.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
