TAFT Now Makes the Statement That He Favors Arbitration Regarding the Panama Canal.

NEW YORK, Jan. 5. — President Taft on Saturday declared himself unequivocally in favor of arbitrating the dispute between the United States and Great Britain over the Panama Canal tolls in the event of the impending negotiations failing to bring about a settlement. This was the first public declaration of the President of his attitude toward the question. He was speaking at a luncheon given in his honor by the International Peace Forum.
