The Council Opens Tenders for the King Street Work.

Cost in the Neighborhood of \$3 Per Square Yard-Referred to the Board of Works.

Tenders for the vitrified brick pavement on King street were opened last night by the city council as follows: Lunch & Lynch-8,100 yards brick pavement, city to furnish brick, at cents; 690 yards concrete gutter, at \$1.09; 2,965 lineal feet curb, 25 cents; two catch basins, readjust, \$6 each; 20 new catch basins, \$6 each; one manhole \$6; 3,650 feet sewer pipe digging, city to furnish pipe, at 60c.

An alternative offer to lay the brick at 85 cents, was made, any brand of regular paying cement to be used. The aldermen figured up that the tender would amount to about \$3.13

per square yard.

The Medicinal Values of Common Plants and an Easy Method of Learning Them.
