

FORECAST OF THE MESSAGE

McKinley Will Suggest Armed Intervention by the U. S.

ALL AWAIT THE MESSAGE

Until it is Received the Situation Will be Strained.

New York, April 5.—Was is considered inevitable that President McKinley's message, it means nothing short of forcible intervention to end the war in Cuba. While the Pope and the powers plan mediation the President has complete confidence in his message. The message will go to Congress tomorrow at noon.

NO MORE DIPLOMACY.

Cable messages from Minister Woodford indicate that Spain is endeavoring to reopen diplomatic negotiations. President McKinley, however, considers that the time for diplomatic negotiations has ended. It is admitted in Washington that Pope Leo has offered his services. Spain has proposed that she withdraw her troops from Cuba and the United States will send ships from the United States to the auxiliary from Washington.

SAFETY OF AMERICANS.

Consul General Lee has received instructions from Washington in regard to looking after the safety of Americans in Havana in case of an outbreak. The former has advised that he will probably come simultaneously with the transmission of the President's message.
