GRAND FALLS, N. B., May 28—Mrs. Herbert Wood, who fell ill, gave evidence in the Clark murder case at her home this morning. She remembered the day Phoebe Bell was shot at her house. Phoebe was working for her. Clark came to her house about three o'clock that day and asked her if she would keep his children all summer. She told of the arrival of Ida Pelletier and Claude Murphy.

Her story of the affair was much the same as that of other witnesses. She did not see the revolver in Clark's hand and was not in the room at the time of the shooting.

Clark had nothing to say and the defence called no witnesses. Newman Clark was committed for trial at the September Court and was taken to Andover jail.

### Newsprint Paper Takes Big Price Jump Soon

The Canadian Export Paper Company, Limited, has announced its schedule of export newsprint paper prices for the third and fourth quarters of the current year, the new prices showing very large advances over those prices recently prevailing on their export paper prices.

For the third quarter of 1920, which commences July 1, next, the new prices will be 5 1/2 cents a pound at mill which is equivalent to \$110 per ton. For the fourth quarter of 1920 which commences October 1 next, the new prices will be 6 1/2 cents a pound, mill, which is equivalent to \$130 a ton.

The Canadian Export Paper Company, Limited, controls approximately \$25,000,000 per annum of the export paper output of five of the leading Canadian newsprint producers.

It is generally expected that the other Canadian producers of newsprint paper in Canada will advance their prices in line with those adopted by the Export Paper Company, as is usually the case, and that for the last six months of this year the highest prices yet paid for export newsprint from Canada will be netted by the companies.
