**COURT REFUSED**  
**WORKER DAMAGES**

**Man Injured in Liquor Com-**  
**mission Warehouse Lost**  
**Compensation Suit.**

Judgment holding that an employe  
of the Quebec Liquor Commission  
who was engaged in the handling  
and distribution of cases and boxes  
of liquor in a warehouse of the  
Commission was not entitled to  
the benefits of the Workmen's Com-  
pensation Act has been handed down  
by Mr. Justice Gibson at Quebec.

The point arose in the case of  
Bedard vs. the Quebec Liquor Com-  
mission where the plaintiff sued to  
recover a sum of \$161.25. The plain-  
tiff alleged that he was entitled  
to this sum as compensation for  
suffering and loss of time resulting  
from an accident which occurred on  
October 20, 1921 in a warehouse of  
the company where he was employe.  
He declared that one of his fellow  
workers allowed a box of liquor to  
fall on him causing an injury which  
necessitated hospital treatment for  
some time.

Mr. Justice Gibson declared that  
although the plaintiff did not com-  
plain of the injury on the day that  
it occurred or on the day following  
this fact was not sufficient for the  
court to refuse to believe his  
statement to the effect that he was  
injured in the course of his work.  
It been proved however said the  
judge that the plaintiff had been  
engaged simply to help in the work  
of handling boxes and cases in  
the warehouse. This work was  
done in a part of the warehouse where  
no other motive force than that of  
men or animals was used and accord-  
ingly the plaintiff's work did not  
bring him within the scope of the  
Workmen's Act.

ever made by the late Senator Vest  
of Missouri was made in the course  
of the trial of a man who had wan-  
tonly shot a dog belonging to a  
neighbor. Vest represented the  
plaintiff who demanded \$200 dam-  
ages. When Vest finished speaking  
the jury after two minutes deliber-  
ation awarded the plaintiff \$500.  
The full text of the speech is  
printed below.

Gentlemen of the jury—The  
best friend a man has in this  
world may turn against him and be-  
come his enemy. His son or daugh-  
ter that he has reared with loving  
care may prove ungrateful. Those  
who are nearest and dearest to us  
those whom we trust with our happi-  
ness and our good name may become  
traitors to their faith. The money  
that a man has he may lose. It  
flies away from him; perhaps when  
he needs it most. A man's reputa-  
tion may be sacrificed in a moment  
of ill-considered action. The peo-  
ple who are prone to fall on their  
knees to do us honor when success  
is with us may be the first to throw  
the stone of malice when failure  
settles its cloud upon our heads.  
The one absolutely unselfish friend  
that man can have in this selfish  
world; the one that never deserts

grateful or treacherous is the dog.  
Gentlemen of the Jury—a man's  
dog stands by him in prosperity  
and in poverty; in health and in  
sickness. He will sleep on the cold  
ground where the wintry winds  
blow and the snow drives fiercely,  
if only he may be near his masters  
side. He will kiss the hand that  
has no food to offer; he will lick the  
wounds and sores that come in  
encounter with the roughness of  
the world. He guards the sleep of  
his pauper master as if he were a
