

WEATHER CONDITIONS FAVOR already arriving at the front, Secre-BULGARIANS.

LONDON, Dec. 8. The Salonika correspondent of Reuter's Telegram Company sends the following despatch under date of Tuesday: Weather conditions having improved the Bulgarians on Monday bombarded the entire British line at Strumitza for the whole day. Then they launched an infantry attack which was repulsed. Although fight-

ing on this front still continues, whether the Bulgarians intend to press their attack and what their strength is, it is difficult to establish at present. The British casualties thus far are reported as slight. At Krivolak there was begun an important local engagement between French and Bulgarian artillery on Monday. It is reported here that complications are threatened between Bulgaria and Turkey and that distrust is increas-
