WEEKLY MEETING.

The Weekly Meeting of the City Council was held yesterday afternoon. Mayor Cook presided. Councillors Martin, Outerbridge, Collier, Ryan and Dowden were present.

After the Minutes of last Meeting were read and confirmed the following matters were considered:

John J. Neville called attention to the need of having some chipped stone placed on the newly tarred roads so as to prevent horses slipping. This matter was referred to the Engineer.

C. P. Egan asked permission to place a concrete side walk in front of his premises. Duckworth Street, whether or not the Council would be prepared to contribute half cost of same. The Engineer is to submit estimates of this work and report next Meeting.

The Newfoundland Motor Association called attention to the need of having signs erected at Bowring Park for the benefit of Motorists as it has been brought to its attention that of late cars have been driven in opposite directions with the result that accidents are likely to occur. The signs will be immediately placed.

A communication was also read from Newfoundland Motor Association stating its willingness to co-operate with the Council in having the South Side Road reserved for pedestrians on Sundays, holidays and half-holidays, and that a notice to this effect had been already published in the Daily papers. It was ordered that the thanks of the Council be tendered the Association for its co-operation in this matter.

Mr. Fred Fitzpatrick wrote re the need of opening up a new Street connecting Prince of Wales Street with Pennywell Road. This he claimed was very necessary and would be of great benefit to residents in this section of the town. Committee of Council has already this matter under consideration and will report on the same at an early date.

Messrs. Butler, Gardner and Young called attention to the fact that they are greatly inconvenienced owing to their houses not being numbered and asked that this be given immediate consideration. Tenders for the numbering of houses and painting of street signs are to be called for.

E. Phillips wrote of the very bad condition of Allendale Road. Repairs there will be undertaken by the Road Inspector as soon as possible.

The Home Estate Co. Ltd. made application for lease of land for building purposes Cavell Street. It is their intention to erect some Workmen's dwellings at an early date. Consideration was deferred.

In the matter of the claim of George Shummonds for compensation for damages owing to his horse being injured through falling on the newly tarred roads, the Council acknowledged no liability.

Sgt. Soper of the N4d. Road Commission requested payment of Motor Car Taxes collected to the end of July.

The City Clerk reported that up to this date some 673 cars and 10 Cycles have been registered, the total receipts for which were \$49,752.75; and of this number of cars 618 were registered by persons resident within the City from whom fees to the amount of \$19,313.37 were collected as against 55 residing outside the City limits, who paid \$1439.35. Out of the above amount the City is entitled to retain only the sum of \$6,674.00. A cheque for \$13,000.00 has already been forwarded the Commission and it was decided that the balance of \$2075.00 be sent on. There are quite a number of motor car owners outside the City limits who have not registered their present year numbers and time all have been made comply with the Motor Act the receipts for registration fees will exceed previous years.

The following plans were passed subject to the approval of the City Engineer:

Drainage Samuel Martin, Prince of Wales Street; Extension of G. Button, Franklin Avenue; S. Anthony, McNeil Street and E. Knox, Nunnery Hill.

The Medical Officer of Health reported one new case of Typhoid in the City during the week.

Of late considerable complaint has been made that Taxi Drivers are not complying with the regulations as regards the placing of the words "For Hire" on their cars. In connection with this matter the following notice of motion was given by Councillor Outerbridge:

I give Notice that I will at the next meeting of the St. John's Municipal Council move the following:—

(a) "That motor cars licensed and recognized by the St. John's Municipal Council as being for hire be supplied by the Council (as quickly as possible, without cost to the owners) with suitable car badge stating that the car is 'licensed for hire' and that have been done, the owners of other cars (whose cars have not been licensed for hire, found soliciting or carrying hire business be subject to be or imprisonment.

(b) That upon the sale of any motor vehicle upon which the license has been paid for the current year and which license it is desired to transfer to the new owner, that the person selling the car be required to register the transfer of the license

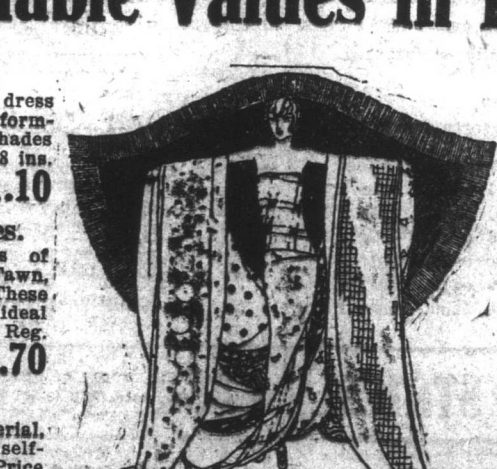

at the office of the St. John's Municipal Council. And that any person transferring a car license upon selling a car, without registering the transfer at the Council Office be subject to fine or imprisonment.

(c) That persons from outside settlements driving a motor vehicle through the City limits, said vehicles not bearing identification plates recognized by the St. John's Municipal Council, be required to remove said vehicle from the City limits immediately.

As will be seen from the daily papers the past few weeks the Rotary Club has done a great service for the youth of the City in providing Playground apparatus and giving the boys and girls a chance to engage in healthy out-door exercise. The following motion was moved by Councillor Outerbridge and unanimously agreed to:—
