## **Nationalist Turkey**

Mr. H. Charles Woods, who gives in the Contemporary Review his impressions of "Turkey under the Nationalists," seems to damn Mustapha Kemal's administration with faint

praise in the following passage: From the internal standpoint, the Government is Nationalistic and anti- A Trust Company as clerical to the extreme. Its Nationalism takes the form of attempts to get rid of all foreign influences, to hamper the work of foreigners in Turkey, and to prevent the importation of foreign goods even where these are practically necessary to the welfare of the people. Money is urgently required for the conduct of the State, but attempts are made to attract foreign capital, because the Nationalists fear the conditions to be imposed and because they boast that sooner or later loans will be easy of acquisition.
