Sort your poultry carefully and have the No. 1 stock of uniform quality. Pack the No. 2 stock in separate packages. Pack neatly in nice clean cases bolding from 100 to 200 pounds each. Line the cases with clean paper but never use straw in packing, and never wrap the birds in paper, pack as closely as possible and fill the packages full to prevent shifting about while in transit. Avoid putting more than one kind in a package, as mixtures of geese and ducks, or chickens and turkeys, are more difficult to sell.
