JAPANESE CRUISER TO BE REFLOATED

Asama, Ashore Off Californian Coast, Will Be Saved From Wreck.

(Canadian Press.) Seattle, Wash., March 5.—The Japanese cruiser Asama, which recently went ashore at the entrance to Turtle Bay, Lower California, will be floated soon, according to a report brought from the south by the British naval officer Proteslaus.

The Proteslaus was en route to Esquimalt, B. C., when she received orders to hurry to the assistance of the Asama. The armament and equipment of the Asama were removed, and for a time it was thought the vessel would have to be abandoned, but according to the report brought by the Proteslaus, it was subsequently found that the Asama could be saved, and salvaging operations were begun immediately.

RENOVED COLORED EVANGELIST DEAD

(Canadian Press.) New York, March 5.—Word has been received here of the death in Sebring, Florida, of Mrs. Amanda Smith, the famous colored evangelist. Mrs. Smith was 78 years old. In her career as an evangelist she travelled over the greater part of this country, attracted great congregations in England, and pursued her evangelical work over portions of India and Africa. She took in Chicago an orphanage for children of her race.

TALKS ON MAMMOTH CAVE

Dr. Woolverton Gives Interesting Lecture at Cronyn Memorial.

An interesting lecture on the "Mammoth Cave of Kentucky" illustrated by stereoscopic views and diagrams drawn by the lecturer's daughter, was given in the schoolroom of Cronyn Memorial Church last evening by Dr. Woolverton, at one time president of the Geological Society of London, and a lecturer at the University.

Dr. Woolverton explained at length the wonders of the great natural cave; the animals and fish which inhabited its maze of corridors and underground rivers, all of which were blind, the pitch darkness making eyes useless, and all white in color, as animals and plants growing in darkness always are; the wonderful rock formations and the various interesting features from the geological viewpoint to be seen there.

BODY FOUND, FROZEN

Lumberman Lost His Way Near to Headwaters.

(Canadian Press.) Quebec, March 5.—Lost in a terrible snowstorm, in the hands of Kiskadee, a lumber district, some one hundred and twenty miles north of Quebec city, Wilfred Couturier, 35, was frozen to death, some time in February, and his stiff body was found yesterday about one hundred yards from the road, within a mile and a half of the headquarters of the lumbering company he worked for, at Van Bruggen. Couturier left a camp on February 28 last, and was not seen alive since. He belonged to Quebec.

AROUND WORLD IN 80 DAYS

Dr. J. T. Green, a Western Graduate, Had Remarkable Experience.

The many friends in London of Dr. J. T. Green, a 1910 graduate of Western University, will be glad to know that he has arrived back in Canada safely, after a trip around the world. He left Vancouver the day war was declared as surgeon on the C. P. R. R. M. S. Empress of India, sailing to Japan and China. On arrival at Hong Kong, the ship was taken over by the British Government, and sent to Bombay, where she was purchased by the Indian Prince, the Maharaja of Gwalior, and extensively refitted as a hospital, renamed the Loyalty, and presented to the admiralty, along with a further gift of forty-one motor ambulances.

Exciting Trip. The trip from Singapore, through the Straits of Malacca to Bombay, was very exciting, travelling without delay, and repeatedly changing the course to evade the German cruiser Emden, which was operating along the regular track. During the stay in Bombay, he was fortunate enough to see the departure of 70,000 of India's stalwart sons for the front, and as he said, it was a most inspiring sight to see the Indian troops, escorted by British cruisers, steam away to the strains of the bands playing "It's a Long Way to Tipperary."

The next point of interest was the Suez Canal, and the fortifications along it were of such a nature that the doctor thought the canal would simply spell massacre for them. The Indian troops on one side, and the Australians on the other, were so strongly entrenched that the enemy would have to chance whatever. Through the Red Sea and the Mediterranean the Loyalty, with its 1,000 patients, and its 1,000 warships, no chances being taken of the enemy, the doctor's ship, a British hospital ship.

EUROPEAN WAR AFFECTS WATERWORKS SUPPLY

Pig Lead Used Here Is Contraband of War and Not Available—Contractors Awaited.

Waterworks may seem a long cry from fortifications, and waterworks supplies from munitions of war, but the public utilities commission learned yesterday afternoon that the latter has a very serious effect on the former.

When bids for the year's waterworks supplies were being considered, it was found that some of the bidders had quoted on the type of pig lead used by the department here. The only quotations were on American and Canadian lead. One tenderer explained that the usual quality, which is of British manufacture, was now contraband of war, and none could be obtained in this country, all being kept in the old country.

"They are keeping it in Britain to use on the Germans," said General Manager Glavin. "Well, my only hope is that they give them lots of it," declared Commissioner F. G. Mitchell.

The session of the commission was a tedious one, and one that gave the commissioners lots of figuring, for the bids for the year's supplies were all in, and contracts had to be awarded.

The Westinghouse Company was given another transformer for the sub-station, at a cost of \$12,000.

For those who the three local manufacturing companies all received a share. The Dominion Brass Company received \$1,141.20; the National, \$143.80, and the Empire, \$748.

The Empire Brass Company also received a contract for 27 tons of lead pipe at \$60.70 a ton.

Tenders for pig lead were left to the general manager and Commissioner F. G. Mitchell, with power.

Contracts for printing and office supplies were awarded to the same contractor.

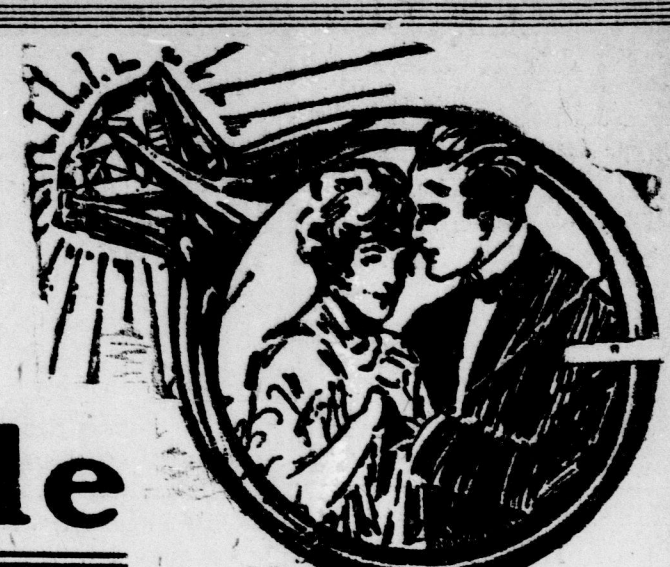
