There arrived in Seattle two days ago three Japanese sealers who were lost from a Japanese schooner in the North Pacific and after drifting for five days in the fogs which are frequent in the northern sea, they brought up on the Island of St. George, one of the Pribyloffs. They were brought down by the steamer Santa Anna, from Dutch harbor, where they were landed by the San Francisco bound Del Monte, which picked them up on the seal island.

The sailors were members of the crew of a Japanese sealing schooner. They were out some distance hunting for seals when a dense fog settled down upon them, and they were unable to find the vessel again. Their fate is unknown to those on the sealer, who doubtless believe the men were drowned.

On their arrival at Seattle the three sealers were taken in charge by the United States federal officers and charged with sealing in United States waters, but it being shown that their vessel was working among the Russian islands in the North Pacific, and they were lost from the schooner after it had been driven to the United States side by a storm, they were released, and their consul at Seattle is arranging for their return to Japan.
