### Salaries to the Educational Profession.

To the Editor of the Maritime Farmer:

Sir—Your issue of the 19th inst., contains an anonymous communication referring to certain remarks, credited to Dr. Rand, respecting salaries. I understood Dr. Rand to say "he had come to the conclusion that, so long as he himself and the Principal of the Normal School continued to accept, without protest such small salaries, relatively, as they were receiving, there was no possibility of any great increase in the salaries of Teachers generally in this Province."

Your correspondent thinks the two gentlemen named are well paid, and represents the salary of Principal Crockett as amounting to \$1500. I happen to know that he does not receive \$2000. Examiner of City Schools, that he retains that office only from necessity, and that for his services as Examiner at the University he has not received as much as \$5 a year.

Let me give your readers, for the sake of comparison, a few examples of the salaries attached to similar positions in this and other Provinces.

Salary of Chief Supt. in N. B. \$1000, and expenses.

Principal of Normal School of N. B. \$1200 President of the University of N. B. \$2200 and residence.

One Professor \$1400, and \$800, or more, from the Dominion Government.

Another Professor, \$1400. Another Professor \$1300, and residence.

Principal of the Grammar School at St. John, \$1500, formerly \$1750.

Chief Supt. in Ontario, the late Dr. Ryerson \$5000, and expenses, with a retiring allowance of \$4000.

Chief Supt. in Quebec, where education is not so far advanced as in N. B., and the duties of the office are less onerous, \$3000 and expenses.

Chief Supt. in Nova Scotia \$2400

Principal of Normal School, \$1500

Any person at all conversant with the qualifications necessary to the successful discharge of the laborious and very responsible duties devolving upon the holder of the position, will, I am sure, not believe that the Province is justified in longer delaying to raise to each of these positions a salary equal to that enjoyed by the gentlemen holding positions of like importance in other Provinces.

It is an obvious reason which influences the authorities controlling this matter in other Provinces, and that reason is applicable in New Brunswick as well.

As the salaries of Teachers must, in the nature of things, bear a proportion to those received by the heads of the profession, in all other callings, it does seem unreasonable that these laborious offices should be deprived of a fair remuneration for their services, and an obstacle thus placed in the way of that increase in the salaries of Teachers generally which is absolutely necessary in order to retain our best Teachers long in the profession in this Province.

### The Commercial Travellers' Case.

To the Editor of the Maritime Farmer:

Sir—In this modern age of money making, every chance is taken to get the sharp business men of the larger cities, endeavor to seize not only upon the trade that naturally and fairly comes about them, but also by means of their agents to seize upon the business that legitimately belongs to other trade centers.

I am sure that the Province is not a small place like Fredericton is apt to be more imposed upon in this way than St. John or other larger commercial cities.

What do we find at this present time?

Our large lumbermen, country dealers, country buyers, and in some cases, even housekeepers in this city, are supplied not by the town merchants who live with us by the year round, and pay equally towards our civic burdens, but by agents of large houses, Montreal, Halifax and elsewhere, who come to our city and perhaps sell Mr. Randolph or Mr. Hodges, it may be, a large quantity of tea or other goods, and immediately afterwards perhaps at their hotel, meet some gentleman largely concerned in buying supplies for the lumber trade, who has come to Fredericton expressly to deal with our merchants, and the agent and supply purchaser then and there strikes a bargain, depriving our fellow citizen merchant of a large sale, which he might otherwise have effected.

This course is in all legitimate and fair, and the least any fair and honorable man coming here to do business could do, would be to say the small trader, who is supplied by the City Corporation, for the freedom of the city.

I regret to say, Mr. Editor, that this License fee is dodged and avoided by every legal trick possible. They have found that there is a discriminating provision in the Act of Assembly, intended to allow persons residing in York County to do business in the city, which however reads so as to exempt any retailer of the County from payment of License fee, and a sharp Shoen and Lumber Merchant, who happened to have a piece of land in the Parish of Southampton, fall into his hands for an old debt of about thirty dollars, formed a Syndicate of three Halifax, Montreal, and St. John Merchants, and also from the County of York, and conveyed them the land jointly at \$1000 per head, thereby himself pocketing his share about seven times over. He then induced the Assessors of some of the parishes to place their names on the Assessment Roll in the Parish of Southampton, by which little more, if successful, these gentlemen can do business on as large a scale as Mr. Randolph, if they please, by payment of the heavy tax of seven cents per lot in the Parish of Southampton. This matter should be disputed and fought out to the last inch in the courts. And to return to the subject of the Local representatives who obtained such a sweeping vote at the late election, will be expected by the citizens to cause justice to be done to the city at the next session of the Legislature. Another dodge now resorted to is for three or four of these large commercial houses to employ one of these Local Syndicate agents to represent them all in the city, and the seven cents then paid to the Parish of Southampton, gives these houses the freedom of the city to compete with our own merchants. It is a sometimes argued that these runners only sell to the merchants, and not to the consumer; and this is notoriously not true. But even if it were true, it still remains the same, that so far as the law goes, they are free to sell (good goods) they can sell to any citizen by retail if they please, with as much freedom as any of our city merchants.

## The late Mrs. Dr. Brooke.

On Thursday last, at 1 p. m., Mrs. Brooke, relict of the late Rev. Dr. Brooke, for many years Pastor of St. Paul's Presbyterian Church in this city, died at the age of seventy-two.

The deceased lady was born at Bonness, Scotland, and was a daughter of the late Capt. Stewart, of London, G. B.

She was married to Dr. Brooke previous to coming to this country, and it was not long after she settled in this city with her husband as the wife of the Pastor of St. Paul's, that she became interested in every good work connected with the church, congregation and community.

To the poor she devoted herself with untiring zeal and Christian perseverance, visiting them and ministering to their wants, often impelling her health in the good work. She made "the Name" a house in more than name, and was especially kind and attractive to the young folk, who remember her pure, blameless and worthy life with feelings akin to love and veneration.

Over twenty years ago she lost her sight, having contracted rheumatism at the outset through exposure, and blindness gradually came upon her. She received careful medical treatment from Dr. Drysdale, then a surgeon in Garrison here, and afterwards from the late Dr. Robb, of the University, but to no purpose. She remained blind to the end of her life, which, during the latter years, was much afflicted by rheumatism, and she suffered, which she bore, however, with singular meekness.

After the death of her husband in January last, she appeared to sink rapidly, and her death on Thursday last was no surprise to her friends. Her death was a great loss to the church and community, and she will be remembered by the many who have known her.

The remains of the deceased lady were interred last Saturday afternoon, and the funeral was very largely attended—services at the home and at the grave were conducted by Rev. J. J. Macrae. The pallbearers were Hon. Senator Wark, Geo. F. Gregory, R. Napier, Wm. Anderson, Fredericton, James Campbell, James Sutherland, and others. The proceedings were solemn and impressive.

On Sunday at St. Paul's Church, Rev. Mr. Macrae, providing an able sermon, took as his text, 1st Cor. 7 and 15, "Saved ye as by fire." We have space for only a short extract.
