London, April 7 .- Advices from the principa pitals of Europe show that the political situ ion is regarded as serious by leading statesmen ation is regarded as serious by issuing statement and diplomats. Several significant moves have been made during the past few days. The action of the Russian authorities in doubling the strength of the Russian forces in Volhynia is gravely discussed. The greatest activity prevails among the troops gar-risoning the principal fortified places in France. The troops are being continually drilled in military tactics and have been subjected to a series of night alarms. The Pesther Lloyd states that according to semi-official news from Berlin the general European situation is regarded in the German capital as threatening.

The bride fainted and the merrymakers stood for an instant stunned. Mentz was arrested.
