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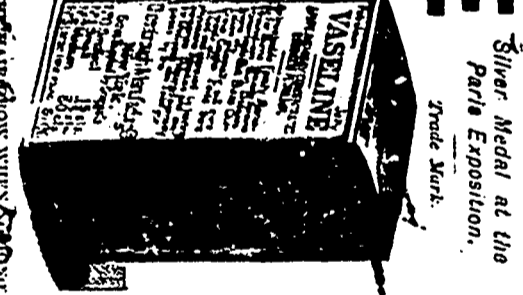

Scientific and Useful.

VENTILATION.—Remember this fact:
Disease lurks in every unventilated room, and
especially in bed-rooms. Fresh air is just as
necessary as food for the body.

HORSERADISH SAUCE.—Grate a quantity
of horseradish, boil it in sufficient water to
give it the consistency of sauce, add a pinch of
salt and two or three table-spoonfuls of tarr-
agon vinegar, then stir in off the fire a gill of
cream beaten up with the yolk of an egg.

BOILING FISH.—After washing thor-
oughly in salted cold water, sprinkle the fish
with salt and pepper, and tie in a clean cloth
with a sprig of parsley. Cover with cold
water, except in case of salmon, when luke-
warm water must be used to preserve the col-
our. Cod requires fifteen minutes for each
pound. A fish weighing one pound will be
done in ten minutes after the water commences
to boil. Drawn butter sauce, with a hard
boiled egg chopped fine and stirred in at the
last is very nice for bass. Oyster sauce is
the best for cod.

FLOWERS IN THE LIVING ROOM.—A
primrose, a hyacinth, or an ivy vine in the
living-room, adds to it a touch of grace
which is at once recognized. A growing
plant has a wonderful way of keeping you
company when you are lonely, and of wel-
coming you when you come, in tired after a
walk. Flowers furnish a room, and their
cheapness, as well as their beauty recom-
mend them to those who prize a charming
parlour.

ONIONS.—From our own experience and
the observation of others, we can fully endorse
the testimony of the St. Louis "Miller,"
of the healthful properties of the above es-
sential. Lung and liver complaints are cer-
tainly benefited, often cured, by a free con-
sumption of onions, either cooked or raw.
Colds yield to them like magic. Don't be
afraid of them. Taken at night, all offence
will be wanting by morning, and the good
effects will amply compensate for the trifling
annoyance. Taken regularly, they greatly
promote the health of the lungs and the
digestive organs. An extract made by boiling
down the juice of onions to a syrup, and
taken as a medicine, answers the purpose
very well, but fried, roasted, or boiled onions
are better. Onions are a very cheap medi-
cine, within everybody's reach, and they are
not by any means "had to take" as the
costly nostrums a neglect of their use may
necessitate. —*Scientific American.*

A CUP OF TEA.—In a recent lecture by
Mr. G. R. Tweedie, F.C.S., London, on
"A Cup of Tea," the speaker divided his
subject into four sections—the tea, the water,
the milk, and the sugar. The lecturer first
drew attention to tea drinking in everyday
life, and shewed that the principal compo-
nents of tea were theine and the essential oil
of tannin, which latter possessed astringent
properties. He informed the audience that
the best time to take tea was about three
hours after dinner or any other heavy meal,
and deprecated in the strongest terms the ex-
cess to which tea drinking is carried by
some people, asserting that such a prac-
tice induced a nervous disorganization and
impeded digestion. He shewed that the
sole difference between black and green tea
was one of preparation, and that both kinds
could be obtained from the leaves of the same
plant. After asserting that the adulteration
of tea had very much decreased of late years,
which the tea drinking public will be glad
to know, the lecturer proceeded to treat of
the various kinds of shrubs grown in different
parts of the world, and the countries where
the different kinds of teas were consumed;
he then came to the consideration of the
milk, its value as a nutritive agent, and re-
ferring to its adulteration, he made the
astounding assertion that, in London alone,
every year, no less than £70,000 was spent
on water which was sold as milk. Passing
on to regard the sugar, the lecturer de-
nied the common error that sugar was injur-
ious to the teeth, bringing forward as an
example the negroes of Jamaica, who he said,
though they were the greatest eaters of sugar
in the world, were proverbial for their beau-
tiful teeth.
