The fact is that Dr. Watson occupies the pulpit of one of the finest churches in Liverpool; everyone in the city is his friend; his salary is large, and he has as much liberty, including a three months' vacation. every year, as any man could desire. One of the trustees of the Broadway Tabernacle remarked to a reporter: "There is no chance of our getting Dr. Watson. We would take him fast enough if we could, and I and many another I know would contribute, specially,
