HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRA-TOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

On the recommendation of the Honorabie the Minister of Customs, and under the provisions of the 8th and 5th sections of the Act passed in the Session of the Parliament of Canada, hold in the Sist year of Hor Majesty's Reign, chaptered 6 and initialed "An Act respecting the Customs," His Excellency, by and with the advice of the Queen's Privy Council for Canada, has been pleased to order, and it is nereby ordered, that the Out Port of Ponetangore (now known as Kincardine), attached to the Port of Goderich, in the Province of Ontarlo, be and it is hereby constituted a Port of Entry and a Warehousing Port, the same to take effect from the First day of October, 1875.
