### CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS. ONTARIO.

The lumber movement in Ontario is not large, for the reason that shipping is practically tied up by the car famine. There is considerable stock waiting to be moved by rail, but the scarcity of cars has been a handicap to business. Some manufacturers have withdrawn their price lists and are refusing to accept orders until the prospects of being able to make shipment become more promising. The situation from the standpoint of demand is quite satisfactory. In the words of a prominent dealer, "business is good, and a fine winter trade seems assured. Mill men could sell more lumber if they had it, but it frequently happens that they are not able to supply the assortments wanted.

There is no shading of prices on hardwoods. The scarcity becomes more pronounced each week. Maple is less active and weaker than other woods. It is now seldom bought for furniture making, which may account in part for its dullness. Basswood is as much sought after as ever.

#### MANITOBA AND BRITISH COLUMBIA.

The activity in the lumber and shingle business of Manitoba and British Columbia has moderated slightly, although manufacturers are still behind with orders. It is rumored that a further advance is about to be made in the price of British Columbia lumber for delivery throughout Manitoba and the Territories, and no doubt such an advance will be followed by similar action by the manufacturers of white pine. The mills of British Columbia have a great deal of lumber waiting shipment. It is estimated that the East Kootenay Lumber Company have orders on their books for 300 carloads, largely for shipment eastward. The supply of labor for logging operations is still inadequate and is greatly hampering the shingle production. The new list issued by the British Columbia Lumber and Shingle Manufacturers Association makes an advance of about 15 cents per thousand on all grades of shingles for Ontario delivery. XXX, 5 butts to 2 inches, are now quoted at \$3.45; XX, \$2.65; XXX, 6 butts to 2 inches, \$3; XXXX, 6 butts to 2-1/2 inch, \$3.20.

#### UNITED STATES.

The lumber trade of the United States is firm, although rather featureless. There continues to be a steady movement of white pine into the hands of the consumer and a corresponding disposition on the part of dealers to replenish their stocks as completely as possible. The receipts of lumber at Tonawanda during October
