ARTICLE 21. Both parties state categorically that 6. they have carried out their obligations under Article 21 and released all prisoners of war and civilian internees: Each party has, however, made claims against the other. Some progress has been made during the period under report in the clearing of claims and counterclaims made by the parties. The Commission has had detailed discussions with the two parties on this question and has impressed in upon them the necessity for settling these claims and counter-claims as expeditiously as possible. The two parties have agreed to settle all the pending claims and counter-claims expeditiously and by the 10th June, 1955 at the latest.
