- 5.4 All other members of the staff of the Office will have, in respect of their functions, the immunities described in Section 22(b) of the Convention. Such immunity, however, shall not apply in the case of traffic accidents.
- 5.5 In respect of paragraph 3 above, the provisions of paragraphs (b), (e) and (g) of Section 18 of Article V and paragraphs (a), (e) and (f) of Section 22 of Article VI of the Convention shall not apply to any Canadian citizen residing or ordinarily resident in Canada.
- 5.6 The Secretary-General shall communicate to the Government the list of staff members of the Office coming under paragraphs 3, 4 and 5 above, to be updated as necessary.
- 5.7 In addition to the foregoing, other persons officially invited by the Office with the approval of the Centre, or who have official business with the Office, shall have their applications for any visa required by Canadian law dealt with as speedily as possible prior to entry. Where necessary, the United Nations will furnish such persons with a certificate, pursuant to Section 25 and 26 of Article VII of the Convention, stating that they are travelling on the official business of the United Nations.

6. ARTICLE V

Liability

6.1 The Government shall not be held responsible for any damage or claim arising out of the operations of the Office. The Centre shall make appropriate arrangements to cover liability for dealing with any action, claim or other demand that may be brought against the United Nations or the Centre arising out of the operations of the Office.
