THE INTERNATIONAL JOINT COMMISSION IS COMPOSED OF SIX MEMBERS, THREE APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND THREE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE CANADIAN SECTION OF THE COMMISSION IS GENERAL THE HONOURABLE A. G. L. MCNAUGHTON. THE OTHER CANADIAN MEMBERS ARE MR. J. L. DANSEREAU, PROMINENT MONTREAL ENGINEER, AND DR. D. M. STEPHENS, CHAIRMAN OF THE MANITOBA HYDRO-ELECTRIC BOARD.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE UNITED STATES SECTION IS THE HONOURABLE DOUGLAS MCKAY, FORMERLY SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR. THE OTHER MEMBERS ARE MR. E. W. WEBER, SPECIAL ADVISER TO THE CHIEF OF THE UNITED STATES ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS, AND MR. F. L. ADAMS, FORMERLY OF THE FEDERAL POWER COMMISSION.
