

3. What was their nationality.
4. How many were returned at their own free will.
5. How many were returned at their private expense.
6. How many were sent back (repatriated) at the expense of the Government.
7. How many isolated girls and women have been among these repatriations.
8. Who arranges for the purchase of tickets.
9. Who provides the cost of tickets.
10. Whether tickets are bought to final destination or to port of disembarkation.
11. Who arranges for the visas.
12. Whether transit visas are provided.

And also,—Return to an Address to His Excellency the Governor General, of the 20th October, 1932, for a copy of all telegrams, correspondence, letters, reports and all other documents exchanged between the Dominion Government and the Quebec Government, since 1921, in connection with the bringing back of Canadians from the United States.

Mr. Stewart (Leeds), a Member of the King's Privy Council, presented,—Return to an Address to His Excellency the Governor General, of the 13th October, 1932, for a copy of the orders in council passed on the 14th of February, 1914, and the 23rd of October, 1917, allowing the Laurentide Power Company to build a dam at Grand'Mère, Quebec.

Mr. Weir (Melfort), a Member of the King's Privy Council, presented,—Return to an Order of the House of the 27th October, 1932, for a copy of all correspondence, letters, telegrams and other documents exchanged between the Dominion Government and all persons, corporations, or others in connection with the dismissal of Joseph Perrault from the experimental station at Ste-Anne-de-la-Pocatière, Kamouraska county, and also copy of the evidence of the investigation which was held at Ste-Anne-de-la-Pocatière in connection with this case.

Sir George Perley, a Member of the King's Privy Council, presented,—Return to an Order of the House of the 19th October, 1932, for a Return showing:—

1. Whether the following companies: Manseau Construction Co., Canadian Dredging Co., St. Lawrence and Great Lakes Dredging and Construction Co. have done dredging work since 1926.
2. If so, how much work has been done by each per year, in what localities, and for what amounts.

By Mr. Blair:—Order of the House for a Return showing:—

1. Whether certain payments were made by the Federal Government to W. N. Tilley, K.C., (a) for legal services for or to the Government of Canada during the years 1919, 1920, and 1931; (b) for general counsel work during the said years for and to the Government of Canada.
2. If so, for what services and what amounts.
3. For what retainers or services the said Mr. Tilley is retained by the Government of Canada.
