13.	Canada Temperance Act R.S., c. T-5	(1) Subsection 120(3) is repealed and the following substituted therefor: “(3) Such vendor shall file the certificates and keep a register of all such sales, indicating the name of the purchaser and the quantity sold, and shall make an annual return of all such sales, on the 31st day of December in every year, to the <u>chief officer</u> of customs within whose revenue division the county or city is situated.” (2) Subsection 126(4) is repealed and the following substituted therefor: “(4) The vendor shall make an annual return of all such sales on the 31st day of December in every year to the <u>chief officer</u> of customs within whose revenue division the county or district is situated.” (3) Sections 130 and 131 are repealed and the following substituted therefor: Prosecution by chief officer of customs “130. Any prosecution for any such penalty or punishment may be brought by or in the name of the <u>chief officer</u> of customs within whose official division the offence was committed, or by or in the name of any person. 131. Such <u>officer</u> of customs shall bring such prosecution, whenever he has reason to believe that any such offence has been committed, and that a prosecution therefor can be sustained, and would not subject him to any undue measure of responsibility in the premises.” (4) Subsection 165(2) is repealed and the following substituted therefor: “(2) As soon as any intoxicating liquor and the receptacles containing the same are forfeited to the Crown, the judge by whom such forfeiture is adjudged and declared shall immediately transmit to the Minister of National Revenue, a notice in writing specifying the quantities and descriptions of the intoxicating liquor so forfeited, and shall order that such intoxicating liquor shall immediately be deposited in a <u>place of safekeeping</u> within the province wherein such intoxicating liquor is forfeited as aforesaid, to be disposed of as the Minister of National Revenue may direct.”
