OLD AGE SECURITY ACT

AMENDMENTS RESPECTING ESCALATION OF PENSIONS, RESIDENCE REQUIREMENTS, INCREASE IN GUARANTEED INCOME SUPPLEMENT

Hon. John C. Munro (Minister of National Health and Welfare) moved that Bill C-207, to amend the Old Age Security Act, be read the second time and referred to the Standing Committee on Health, Welfare and Social Affairs.

He said: Mr. Speaker, it is a great pleasure to rise in the House today to recommend swift passage of the bill now before the House. In this connection, in terms of the assistance it renders our senior citizens it would be useful to review the record of the Liberal government since 1963 with regard to improving the financial security of Canadians over 65, especially when compared with the previous administration up to 1963. I think you will find, Mr. Speaker, it is a very enviable record indeed.

In 1963 the old age security pension stood at \$65 a month. In 1964, under a Liberal government, the old age security pension was raised to \$75 a month. In 1966, two years later, the government again moved in this field and
