

evidence at any trial to be had thereon, and that the same was done in pursuance and by the authority of this Act, and if it shall appear to be done so, or if any action or suit shall be brought after the time herein before limited for bringing the same, then a verdict shall be given for the defendant.

51. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That it shall and may be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to appoint a proper person to be Adjutant General of the Militia of this Province, who shall have the rank of Colonel, and do all matters and things appertaining to the said office of Adjutant General.

52. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That no person who shall have been discharged from Her Majesty's service as a Sergeant, shall be obliged to serve in any inferior station in the Militia of this Province, unless having been such Non-commissioned Officer in the said Militia, he may have been reduced according to Law.

53. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That every Sergeant of Militia, duly appointed, shall be exempt from serving as Constable for and during such time as he shall hold such appointment as Sergeant.

54. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That an Act of the Parliament of this Province, passed in the forty-eighth year of the reign of King George the Third, entitled, "An Act to explain, amend and reduce to one Act of Parliament, the several Laws now in being for raising and training the Militia of this Province;" and also "An Act passed in the fiftieth year of the said reign, entitled, 'An Act for the relief of minors of the Societies of Menonists and Tunkers;" and also an Act passed in the fifty-third year of the said reign, entitled, "An Act to amend an Act passed in the forty-ninth year of His Majesty's
