

THE ROYALS LEAFS TAKE DOUBLE BILL FROM ROYALS

LEAFS LEFT THE DOUBLE-HEADER GAW TWIRLS HIS FIRST GAME

Brant Puzzles Royals in First Fixture and New Twirler Makes Montreal Pop Them Up in the Second.

MONTREAL, June 13.—The Kelleys leaders put a crimp in the Royal winning streak at Schermer Park this afternoon by taking both ends of a double-header and finishing up Montreal's onward march with a stiff jolt, winning the first clash by a score of 2 to 1, with Brant in the box, opposing McGraw, the Royals selection. The Leafs in the second game overpowered a youthful twirler named Gaw, who had but stepped off the train in Montreal in the morning to report to his new owners. Gaw is quite a youngster, but looks to have the goods in large-sized quantities. He hails from Brockton, Mass.

It happened that the double-header just about brought the Royals to the end of their tether on the pitcher position. McGraw, Smith and Matern have been holding their own with the best, but every second or third day, and so it came about that Dale, Averett and Burke, the weak sisters of the fraternity, so to speak, had to be called in to service for the present spell, including, as it did, two baggy-day encounters in three days. Dale was lucky to get away with a game yesterday, but McGraw, who was pitching the second game in four days, did not fare so well. In the first game of the double-header, not that Brant had so much on him, but the mere combination of blunders which made a win possible on the previous day was lacking. Two hits and one error in the third, when Allen, who had previously forced McGraw, at second, came home on Gilhooley's sacrifice and Yeager's single. That ended the run-getting for the Royals.

The tally that won the game happened along in the sixth inning, when, with one out, Northern walked and scored on Shultz's two-base hit. Thereafter the scoreboard was devoid of anything but errors.

Averett started the second game for the Royals, opposed to Gaw, the new comer. Averett pitched a more or less wobbly way thru four innings and a part of the fifth, when he was relieved by Bill Burke, who more nearly approximated his old-time form in the remaining innings that he has in any time this season. Thru three innings Averett held the Leafs scoreless, but in the fourth O'Hara singled and stole second; Burke fanned, and Northern retired by the shortstop for a fly route, following which, Ed. Holly connected for a safe hit, which, in the fifth, Burke pitched to a double. Shultz singled and Holly scampered home. Benjie produced a sacrifice fly, and Shultz crossed the plate. Gaw also singled, but McConnell ended the slaughter by popping an easy fly to short. The Royals came back with one run in their half of the same session, when Gilhooley singled and stole second, and scored on Griggs' lone single, after Yeager had flied to right field. After Fitzpatrick had opened up a fifth-inning attack with a two-bagger, and the fans were setting up a chorus of "Take him out, Yeager," Burke got himself into a bad hole in the eighth, when he hit Northern and then hit Shultz, after which he had singled, filling the bases. Benjie then produced a rap to Desmond, and Northern came, but was out off at the plate, while Shultz was thrown out at second in the ninth. Gaw wound up the innings by fanning. As a couple of raps by Gilhooley and Yeager, scored, Brant's last run in the eighth.
