CENTRAL DOCKS TO **BE BUILT FIRST** 

Vork on Harbor Improvement Will Commence Between Church and York.

WILL INCREASE FLEET

Merchants' Mutual Line Let Contracts for Several New Freighters.

In order to meet the urgent requirements of Toronto shipping interests, soon as possible, it is the intention of the Toronto harbor commissioners in carrying out their five million dollar dock project, to build first those docks which will be located between Church and York streets. In this way the Richelieu and Ontario Navigation Company lines and the Merchants' Mutual and Canadian Lake lines, the principal shipping interests here, can be provided with modern docking facilities within eighteen months' time after the work is commenced.

after the work is commenced.

The full plans call for the construction of docks along the waterfront from Bathurst street to Parliament street, but the work of doing this will occupy more than three years and for that reason it has been decided to construct the central docks first.

It is claimed by the R. and O. lines and the Merchanis' Mutual Line, that they could at the present time use more than twice the space they now occupy, and both these companies are increasing their fleets.

#### DON'T WANT HEIGHT OF CARS REDUCED

Railways and Shippers Opposed to C. P. R.'s Proposition.

FEAR CAR SHORTAGE

Shippers Say That Result Would Be Big Increase in Freight Expenses.

Strong opposition is to be put forward when the Canadian Pacific Railway places its proposition before the nion Railway Board today to regulate the height of all freight cars in Canada to 131/2 feet from rail to roof. They not only will be opposed in this by the Grand Trunk and Canadian Northern Railways, but also by the shipping interests of the Dominic

It is claimed that if the C. P. R. should be successful in the matter. they would follow it up with the reture height of 261/2 feet from the rail

In opposing the suggestion, the other two roads claim it would practically mean that American cars could not be mean that American cars could not be used on a Canadian railway, as more than 80,000 of these cars are higher than 13½ feet from rail to roof. As thousands of American cars are used by Canadian railways annually the proposed height regulation would mean a serious shortage here.

mean a serious shortage here.

The opposition from the shippers will be that the lower car would mean a smaller car, and that it would seriously increase their freight expenses. This would especially be the case with furniture manufacturers and other firms shipping goods of a bulky nature. A great many of the cars now in use are 15½ feet in height, and the new regulation would mean a two feet lower car.


