PRAYERFUL OVER ALLIED SUCCESS

Synod Sessions Close With Thankful Supplications for Victory.

MUCH PROGRESS MADE

Synopsis of Work Accomplished Read by Archbishop Matheson.

Before the seventh session of the general synod of the Anglican Church was prorogued yesterday morning a prayer of thanksgiving was offered for the success of the allied troops in France and Russia.

Archbishop Matheson, who made the supplication, characterized the allied victories as the success of right and truth. He said: "I rejoice with every true Britisher in this great triumph. I consider it but the forerunner of greater triumphs to come."

Dr. Davidson of Montreal, Provost Macklem, Archdeacon Ingles and Rev. W. McKim also gave addresses expressing the gratitude and satisfaction of the house in learning of the latest triumph on the fields of Flanders.

MADE GOOD PROGRESS

Archbishop Matheson read a synopsis of the work accomplished by the synod during the session, and remarked that excellent progress had been made by the house on the questions which had been discussed.

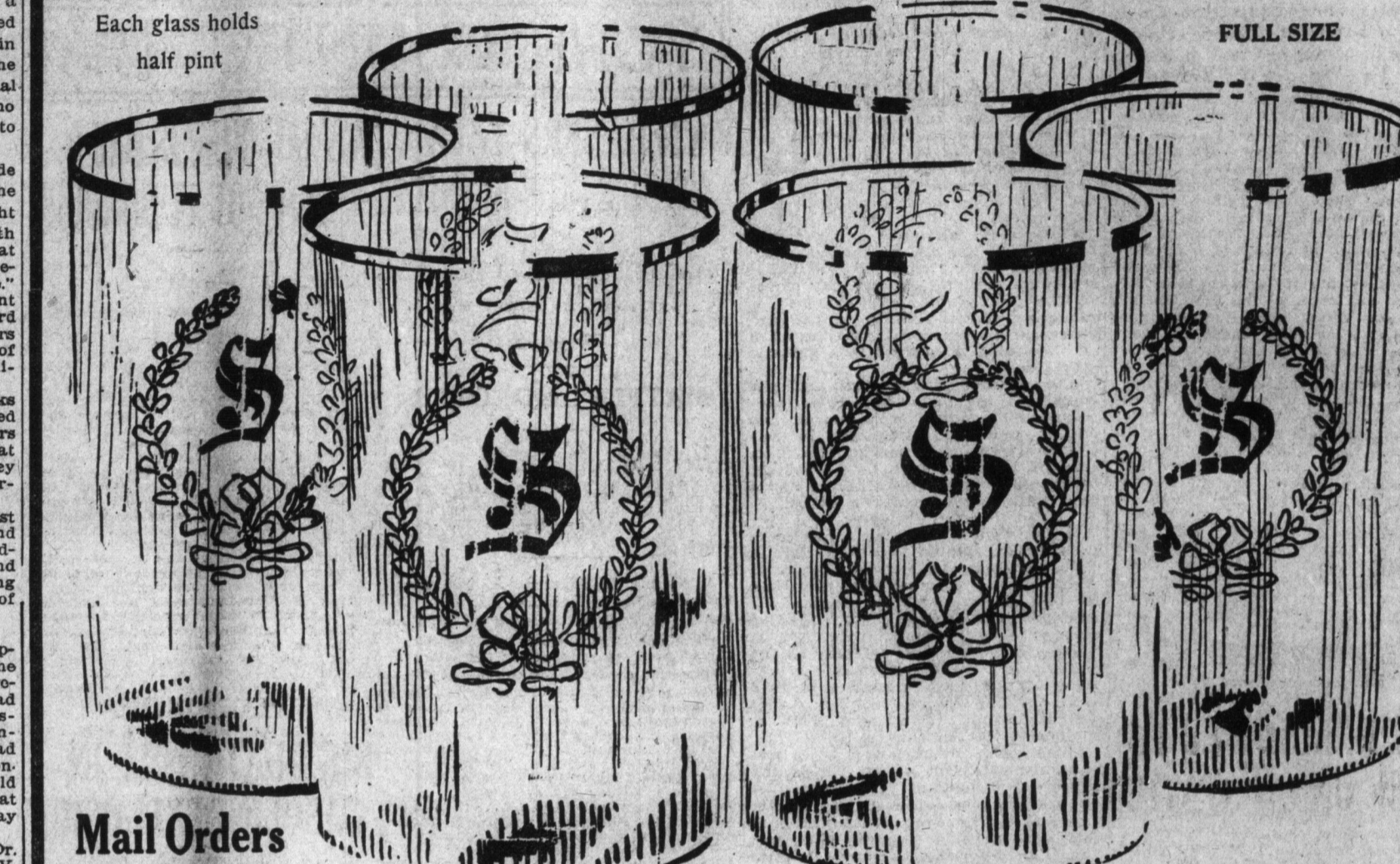
