GERMANS INDIGNANT REFUSE SETTLEMENT

United States Unable to Secure Disavowal of Lusitania Case From Berlin.

WASHINGTON, D.C., Dec. 21.—Full settlement of the Lusitania case, including reparation for the lives of the American victims, has been postponed by the dismissal of the German naval and military attaches and the American demands on Austria-Hungary as a result of the sinking of the Ancona. An agreement was practically reached soon after the American note to Great Britain, protesting against the remarks, had been published in Germany. The note, it is said, created a remarkable pro-American sentiment in Germany.

Negotiations between Secretary Lansing and Count von Bernstorff, German ambassador, were progressing when the United States demanded the withdrawal of Capt. Boy-Ed and Capt. von Papen.

That act, according to advices here,

caused German opinion to swing back to resentment of the action of the United States.

OFFERING OF LAMBS MOSTLY HEAVY CLASS

Price, Notwithstanding, Runs Up as High as Ten-Seventy-Five.

BUTCHERS' ARE ACTIVE

Receipts Exceptionally Light and Those Offered Are Readily Picked Up.

Receipts of live stock at the Union Stock Yards were 27 carloads, comprising 366 calves, 238 hogs, 218 sheep and lambs, 61 calves and 3 hogs.

Butchers' activity—The receipts being light caused an active market, while it lasted, which was a very short time, as offerings being cleaned up before or shortly after 9 a.m. Prices were firm, but unchanged at Monday's quotations.

Stocks and Feeders.—There were some enquiries, but offerings being small, there was little doing, and values remained unchanged.

Milkers and Springers.—Only a limited number were offered, and these were quickly taken; that is the good to choose from. Values were firm.

Calves.—The number offered was small, quality generally common to medium. Prices remained steady.

Sheep and Lambs.—The bulk of the lambs was composed of heavyweights, but sellers were asking high prices for them. Prices for lambs also were firm, but steady with Monday's values selling up to \$10.75 for the tops. Sheep also were steady.

Hogs.—Receipts were light and prices again began to ascend, selling at \$2.25 per cwt. fed and watered.
