United States Unable to Secure Disavowal of Lusitania Case From Berlin.

WASHINGTON, D.C., Dec. 21.-Full settlement of the Lusitania case, including reparation for the lives of the American victims, has been postponed by the dismissal of the German naval and military attaches and the American demands on Austria-Hungary as a result of the sinking of the Ancona. An agreement was practically reach. soon after the American note to Great Britain, protesting against the blockade, had been published in Ger-many. The note, it is said, created a remarkable pro-American sentiment in Germany.
