THE ORBITS OF THE SPECTROSCO

This star ( $\alpha = 18^{\text{h}} 07\text{m} 59\text{s}$ ,  $\delta = +79^{\circ} 59'$ ) was one of the first twelve binaries discovered at Victoria, B.C., the announcement of which appeared in the "Astronomical Society of Canada" for November 1918.

Dr. J. S. Plaskett secured five plates of the star in 1918, and in 1919, 28 plates were secured. All of these in 1918, were measured on the Hartmann Comparators. From the measures of the first 14 or 15 of these, it was possible to get the remaining plates well distributed. The velocities did not, however, agree well with a mean velocity, and the same phase showed as reasonable agreement between the plate number 2923 on the Hartmann Comparators and a closer examination of the plate revealed eleven new lines. A re-examination of all of the previous plates, by Dr. J. S. Plaskett in 1918, showed that on seven of these plates the lines of the two components are just
