the laws and usages of the craft, and for the purpose of appealing to a higher masonic authority.

A member withdrawing, &c.

44. If any member shall withdraw from his Lodge, he shall not be eligible to join any other Lodge, unless he produce a certificate of his good conduct, from the Lodge to which he formerly belonged.

All complaints that cannot be accommodated to be reduced into writing and transmitted to the grand secretary.

45. All differences or complaints, that cannot be accommodated privately, or in some regular Lodge, shall be reduced into writing and delivered to the grand secretary, to lay them before the grand master, or the proper board or committee appointed by the Grand Lodge. When all parties shall have been summoned to attend thereon, and the case shall have been investigated, such order and adjudication may be made as shall be authorized by the laws and regulations of masonry.

Lodge to have a seal.

46. Every Lodge should have a masonic seal, to be affixed to all certificates and other documents proper to be issued.

Certificates how to be granted.

47. No Lodge shall grant a certificate to a brother unless he was initiated therein, or has been admitted a member thereof, and which certificate must be signed by the master, wardens and secretary, and the Lodge seal affixed; the brother to whom
