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Mr. Gould may be called the Napoleon of American finance. He was born in Roxbury, Delaware county, New York, and is now about fifty-five (55) years old. He is rather a small man, of dark complexion, dark eyes and hair, and usually wears a short, black, full beard. He is a quiet, taciturn man, not given to many words, nor to letting his opinion appear in his face or in his actions. Born of poor parents, he had simply a plain country-school education, but was anxious to become of some consequence in the world, and early turned his attention to civil engineering, in which he became quite proficient; in fact, he made the first official map of Delaware county, which became the standard, and has remained such ever since. In this way he made his first two hundred (200) dollars. He is domestic in his habits, and is strongly attached to his family and his home. He has no sporting tastes, although he enjoys a cruise now and then on his splendid steam yacht "Atalanta." His city residence is on Fifth avenue, New York, and he also has an elegant country seat on the right bank of the Hudson, near Yonkers. Mr. Gould may be roughly estimated to be worth about one hundred millions of dollars.
