

M. P.'S ENGAGE IN FISTIC BOUT DURING RECESS

Col. Currie Smacks Face of
Member For Alleged
Insult.

LATTER USES STICK

Chief Liberal Whip Succeeds
in Separating the
Combatants.

OTTAWA, Nov. 5.—Bad blood, both
within and without the chamber, was
shown during the deliberations of the
Commons today. During the afternoon,
while Hon. J. A. Calder was present-
ing to the House the report of the
soldiers' civil re-establishment com-
mittee, he was subjected to a series of
pertinent questions by Col. J. A. Currie
of East Simcoe. In his answer to one
of these he evoked the remark from
the East Simcoe man that he was
"joking the question."

Several interruptions occurred, and
Dr. Cowan of Regina sitting behind
the colonel, advised him to "go back
to his dugout."

The member for East Simcoe bided
his time, and at 6 o'clock, when recess
came, he approached Dr. Cowan in the
corridor, and with the ironic remark
"You insulted me in the House just
then," drew his open hand with a re-
sounding smack, first across the face
and then across the left cheek of the
member for Regina.

The latter in retaliation brought his
walking-stick down across the head of
the colonel, and the altercation in-
creased in fury. But James A. B. B.,
chief Liberal whip, acting in the cap-
acity of peacemaker, separated the com-
batants and peace settled over the
battlefield.

The colonel was still in a combative
mood. In the House later in the evening
he precipitated himself into the de-
bate with zest and vigor. Mr. Calder
had made a threat which has frequently
been made by the present govern-
ment, but which is now but little heeded.
He declared in fine that the govern-
ment had no intention of granting
further general gratuities to soldiers,
and that if parliament didn't approve
of that stand then it would be neces-
sary for the Government to resign.

Major Andrews, of Centre Winnipeg,
thought that the Government's finan-
ce expenditures were misleading, and
declared that the policy of borrowing
which the Government had pursued
since the war commenced, was wrong.
Canada had made money out of this
war, and that money had to be taxed
by taxation. He moved that the com-
mittee reconsider the proposal of the
gratuities for soldiers.

Major Andrews' motion was carried.
Colonel Currie supported Major An-
drews, and in the course of his re-
marks he came into conflict with Dr.
Edwards of Frontenac.

Inconsistency of Unionists.
The member for East Simcoe declared
that it was not fitting that Unionist
members should oppose the soldiers'
demands for further financial assist-
ance inasmuch as so many of these
members owed their seats in the House
to the soldiers. "What will happen if
we go to the country on this issue?"
he asked. "The war-time elections are
not so far off, and the Unionist mem-
bers and other pro-Germans of Ont-
ario and the West will have the vote
again."

"They are quite as good as the
Huns," remarked Assistant Chief
Whip Davidson of Annapolis.
"If it had not been for the support
of the Finns and their comrades," re-
torted Col. Currie, "certain gentlemen
would not now be sitting where they
are. It is a poor business to start
sneaking down the backs of the hon-
orable gentlemen have crossed into
this chamber. One-third of the
supporters of this Government were
elected by the help of the soldiers'
votes."

"That isn't true," came from some-
where behind.
"Well, at least, a quarter," amended
Col. Currie. "The soldiers' vote was
used in Canada, and it was used
abroad to elect members. You know
that Mr. Speaker."

A Red-Hot Debate.
Mr. Speaker Rhodes was elected in
Cumberland by the soldiers' vote after
having been defeated by the civilian.
The reference brought laughter.
Dr. Edwards intervened to say that
not half a dozen members had been
elected by the soldiers' vote, and a
quarrel started as to the accuracy of
Dr. Edwards. "I sent my only son
to the front, and he remained there till
the finish," said the member for Fron-
tenac, hotly.

The medical profession was badly
needed overseas," retorted Col. Currie.
"Why didn't you go with your son?"
"I offered my services and they were
declined," said Dr. Edwards. Mr.
Speaker intervened at this point, and
stopped the dialogue, though Dr. Ed-
wards was heard to mutter, "I'll at-
tend to you." He adjourned the
debate.
