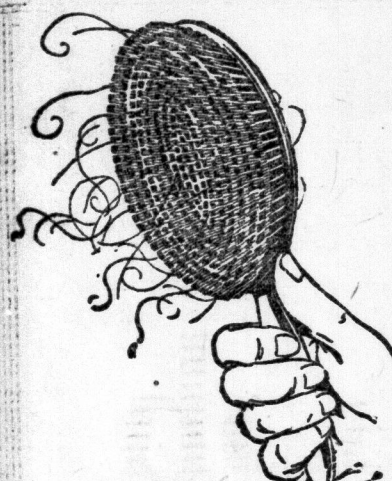

MILLS ELECTED; UNOPPOSED IN FORT WILLIAM

**Ontario Minister of Mines
Gets Acclamation At
Nomination.**

FORT WILLIAM, Ont., July 19.—
Hon. Harry Mills, Ontario Minister of
Mines, was declared elected by ac-
clamation to a seat in the Provincial
House for this constituency, rendered
vacant by his elevation to cabinet rank.
There was no opposition, and return-
ing Officer Brown at the close of
nomination proceedings at 2 o'clock,
declared Mills elected by acclamation.

TORONTO UNWILLING TO PAY SALARIES TO TRANSPORTATION MEN

TORONTO, July 19.—By a close vote
the city council here this afternoon
decided against paying salaries to the
men who serve on the transportation
committee in connection with the street
railway when the Toronto Railway
Company's line when its franchise ex-
pires in August, 1921. The board of
control was asked by the council to
submit the names of men willing to
serve on the commission without sal-
ary. The board of control had recom-
mended paying \$5,000 a year to the
chairman of the commission, and \$5,
000 to each of the other two members,
but the majority of the members of
the council were opposed to this.
Sir Adam Beck was unanimously
appointed as the city's arbitrator in
taking over the street railway.

RUSSIAN REPLY REJECTS BRITISH PEACE TERMS

**London Times Says Soviet
Government Answer Re-
fuses Proposals.**

BRITAIN NOT IMPARTIAL

**Bolsheviki Decline To Come
To London For Conference,
Says Note.**

LONDON, July 20.—The reply of the
Russian Soviet Government to the British
note concerning an armistice with
Poland rejects in substance the British
peace proposals, according to the Lon-
don Times, which today publishes a
summary of the Soviet answer.

The document is a very lengthy one,
and the Times assumes that it will
soon be published by the Government.
The Bolsheviki decline to come to
London for the suggested peace con-
ference, according to the Times, be-
cause they say Great Britain is not im-
partial. They also object to the ad-
mission to the conference of delegates
from the Baltic states, saying Russia al-
ready has made peace with them.

As to Poland, the Bolsheviki Govern-
ment points out that the proposed
armistice line is unfair to Poland, and
that with direct negotiations the Bol-
sheviki are prepared to grant Poland
a much more favorable frontier.

The Bolsheviki reply refuses flatly to
entertain any conditions regarding the
forces of Gen. Wrangel, and the re-
fugees in South Russia, and demands
the unconditional surrender of these.

The tone of the reply is sarcastic,
says the Times, which declares that it
is aimed at driving a wedge between
Poland and the Allies by stimulating
Polish dissatisfaction with the British
proposals.

The Times adds that it believes the
reply will make it more difficult for
Great Britain to enter into trade re-
lations with Russia.

HARDING MAKES SECOND ATTACK ON PRESIDENT

**The Republican Choice Again
Scores Wilson's "Foreign
Commitments."**

MARION, Ohio, July 19.—Senator
Warren G. Harding, Republican candi-
date for the presidency, today issued a
statement, his second in 24 hours, as-
sailing the "foreign commitments" of
President Wilson and the League of
Nations covenant. He quotes Colonel
House, once the president's friend and
adviser, as saying that the negotia-
tions of a peace treaty before a
league of nations was created was
suggested by the European powers and
would have been the "obvious thing"
to do.

Friends of the candidate says that
these attacks indicate that Senator
Harding believes the Wilson foreign
policy has become the paramount issue
of the presidential campaign. It is
expected that in his speech accepting
the nomination on Thursday, Senator
Harding will strike further blows at
the League of Nations.

fields were found to be somewhat dam-
aged by the Hessian fly.

WESTERN WHEAT CROP ESTIMATE 300,000,000 BUS

**Railway Official Places Al-
berta Yield At About
70,000,000 Bushels.**

CALGARY, July 19.—Three hundred
million bushels is the estimate at
present placed upon the wheat crop
of the three western provinces by J.
M. Cameron, general superintendent of
the Alberta division of the Canadian
Pacific Railway, who returned to Cal-
gary Monday morning after a close in-
spection of some portion of the prov-
ince. Alberta's quota, he said, would be
somewhere about seventy million
bushels.
