Dr. J. E. Woodhouse Tells C. of C. It Should Be Sixty-Five Cents.

STRATFORD, Nov. 1.-That the city should spend ten times as much as it does for public health was the declarachamber of commerce today. Dr. Woodhouse told of the health campaigns in other cities. 
