STRANGE THINGS DONE TO DEFEAT BOURASSA

Electors Made Drunk and Police and Letter Carriers Hustling Around for Liberal Votes.

MONTREAL, June 9.—(Special.)—Later returns from the constituencies show some change since the midnight figures were given out. Levesque, who opposed Hon. P. E. LeBlanc in Laval, stated that he was certainly elected by 17. On the other hand, Mr. LeBlanc telephoned that two of the ballot boxes have disappeared and that he will win out in the end. In Vercheres returns show that Geoffroy, Independent Liberal, is elected. On the other hand, Macdonald has elected Sylvester (Cons.). There may be also change in Pontiac, where the Liberal candidate has 90 majority, there are still 12 polls to hear from. In St. Anne, where Walsh is in by eight, Tansey, opposition candidate, will ask for a recount. In St. Hyacinthe, Bourassa's second county, each candidate received the same number of votes, and there will be a recount.

Premier Gouin says that the verdict of St. James is of significance, while Bourassa says: "I have no ambition for leadership of the opposition. I wish to go to Quebec and do my best to help along the execution of the program which I have laid before the electors of the province for the last year. If that means going into opposition, then I will go into opposition."

With regard to the St. Hyacinthe election Mr. Bourassa said men were spirited away and kept on a small island a few miles above the city, where they were piled with whiskey and kept in a state of stupor until the polls were held. The same plan was adopted, he declared, in the city, where "speakers" were organized in the back rooms of workshops and electors invited to enter there.

"The post-office department were called in requisition," continued Mr. Bourassa, "and an entire police force was pressed into the work and the editing of the press was witnessed of letter-carriers in uniform and policemen in uniform rushing about carrying voters to the polls for the government candidates."

"In spite of all this, the government party got only about 140 in the City of St. Hyacinthe, where Beaurapant, the federal member, got 520 in the last election."
