LONG SEARCH FOR HIS FATHER

Russian Boy Set Out Years Ago—Succeeds in Canada.

NEW YORK, Aug. 27. The World to-day says: August Lindor, cashier for the Athens Hotel, has found his father after a search that lasted years and extended half way around the world. The father was a merchant in the Russian Government of Volynia, in the year 1886, possessed of property, a wife, a little boy and girl. One day, two years ago, when August was eight years old, he was taken to the mother searched Europe for traces of her missing husband. In Austria, he was ten, he set out to find his father, but he failed. He went to the postmaster and every official of the Elder Line. Then he went to the streets of New York and spent what he made in buying postage stamps to write to every postmaster of every city in the United States. Last October he learned that his father was at Dorchester, Ont.

In 1897 the mother had died. August said last night that he found his father as a man of fifty with another wife and family of two. His father brought him to stay and share in his business, but he refused.

August Lindor, as he is known there, has been in the hotel business at Dorchester since the spring of last year.

GEO. MANVILLE FENN DEAD

One of the Best of Writers of Boys' Books.

LONDON, Aug. 27.—The death is announced here to-day of George Manville Fenn, the novelist. He was born in 1831.

Boys of the present, and thousands of men who were boys not so many years ago, will deplore the death of Manville Fenn. His books for juveniles were notable for the atmosphere of probability, his heroes acted and talked as real boys might do, and were not the paragons that most authors create. Neither did he have to go far afield for scenes of interest or dramatic incidents. He wrote of the life of the boys in their own world, and he was a master of the art of making his characters and his scenes so real that the reader could almost see and hear them.

In fiction for the grown-ups he was also an adept in skilful delineation of character and originator of absorbing plots. Of recent years he was editor and proprietor of "Once a Week." His books and stories are counted by the score.
