**CITY WILL PAY DOBSON COSTS**

This Decision Was Reached by the Treasury Board Last Night—\$300 Grant to Salvation Army.

At the regular meeting of the treasury board last evening the opinion of the recorder in the suit of Dobson vs. Steeves was read and it was decided to recommend to the council that the amount of the judgment \$125 plus the plaintiff's costs of \$181.71 and the recorder's costs of \$81.80, a total of \$288.51, be paid. A grant of \$300 was recommended for the Salvation Army to assist in their work of caring for the unemployed, and a committee was appointed to arrange for some form of work for the aged men employed on street work during the summer. Changes were recommended in the tariff charges for lumber shipped over the side of steamships, and several minor matters were dealt with.

**WONOPSIS of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.**

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made in certain cases, as follows: by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties—Six months residence on and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 20 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader is good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including time required to clear, house-keep, and cultivate dry acres and water work 200 ft.).
