TWENTY-THREE SIGN THE ROLL

Recruiting Brisk Yesterday—Rev. D. Squires Addresses Recruiting Meeting—Maritime Casualties

Twenty-three recruits were signed yesterday at the Mill street offices, among whom were George F. Cole, Minto, N. B.; Thomas W. Fife, High street; William Duncan, Bass River; Ross Murphy, Bass River; D. J. Allan, St. Lancaster street; J. V. Kistead, Tower street; William V. Owens, Tower street; west; H. C. Simmonds, St. James street; J. C. DeMille, Golding street; H. J. McAvity, Queen street; Fredericks; H. L. Leonard, Adelaide street, and S. C. Colwell, Millidge avenue.

Peter Kynock, of Scotland, a member of the 6th Mounted Rifles, is reported dead from the front.

Douglas Hooper, son of Rev. Capt. E. B. Hooper, is in hospital in Belgium with a foot wound.

Instead of Edward A. Mellor, of this city, a member of the 26th Battalion, being killed in action overseas, according to yesterday's official list, it is now believed that the name should be Edward A. Miller, aged twenty, of Charlton, Cumberland.

Arthur Cotter, writing home from France, where he is with the Canadian Construction Corps, refers feelingly to the death of his brother, Sergt. Frank L. Cotter, and says that up to about the time of his death, the two were engaged with a short distance of each other.

Capt. J. W. Margeson, M. P. P., paymaster, 20th Battalion, is returning to Halifax from France, on military business.

A letter received at his home in Gagetown, from Pte. Percy A. Murray, 1st Battalion, 20th overseas draft, yesterday said that he had not been wounded as was reported. He had helped carry in to safety a wounded officer, but had escaped untouched himself.

Pte. James McDevitt, 20th Battalion, has been wounded in one arm and is now in hospital.

Pte. Guillaume Beuchamp, 60th Battalion, now in the city, enjoys the distinction of having come of a soldier's family. His father, now eighty years old, served in the Franco-Prussian war as a lieutenant; in the French army since the outbreak of war he has lost one leg.

Another, Jacques, has been wounded twice, a third, Edouard, is a physician of war in Germany, and fourth, Francois, has not been heard of for three months.
