PRICES FIRM AS
BUSINESS BEGAN

Were Affected by C. M. Schwab's Optimism—Oils Were Stiffer.

New York, Feb. 28.—Constructive forces were at work at the opening of today's stock market. In the opening session, buying was stimulated to some extent by Charles M. Schwab's optimistic statement on business conditions and the favorable nature of a number of the January railroad earnings reports.

New York, Feb. 28.—Realizing tendencies, which set in late yesterday afternoon, continued through the morning session with trading continuing on a restricted basis. Renewed buying of the copper shares around noon had a somewhat depressing effect on operations on the long side in other quarters.

Montreal, Feb. 28.—Trading was active and prices easier at the opening of the local stock market today. Brompton and Brazilian accounted for about two-thirds of the trading during the first half hour. The former was unchanged at 42, while the latter was 1/2% to 43, Abitibi was off 1/4 to 65. The balance of the list was steady.







MONCTON MAKES SHIFT OF EMPLOYEES

J. D. McBeath Succeeds J. Edgington as the City Engineer.

Following the regular meeting of the City Council on Monday evening, says the Moncton Transcript, a special meeting was held in the Mayor's office. Changes among city employees were discussed.

John Edgington, who has been chief engineer of Moncton for many years, and who is retiring from that position, has been retained as consulting engineer to the city at a salary of \$2,000 per annum. The change will take effect on April 1.

Mr. Edgington moved to Moncton from Glasgow to superintend the installation of the waterworks in 1883. When the system was taken over by

the city about 11 years later, he became engineer for Moncton, and has since continued in that position, having won the reputation of being a very capable engineer.

J. D. McBeath, a popular employee of the city, who has had much experience in engineering work, has been appointed as Mr. Edgington's successor, at a salary of \$2,600. Mr. McBeath, who is an efficient engineer, graduated from the University of New Brunswick in 1906. He has been prominent in athletic circles and is an active supporter of amateur sport. He was engaged in engineering work at Medicine Hat prior to serving overseas. After the war he returned to Moncton. Mr. McBeath is a prominent member of the Moncton Branch of the Engineering Institute of Canada.

H. Mackay, H. McIntyre and J. McDonald, employees of the pumping station, have been retained on a \$55 a month, effective on April 1.

Frank D. Hops, who has been building inspector of the city for several years, has been transferred from that position to the pumping station at a salary of \$28 a week, effective April 1. The duties of this position will henceforth be carried on by the engineering department.
