TORONTO MERCHANT REMEMBERS MANY

An estate of \$263,773 was left by William D. McIntosh, a former Yonge street merchant, in his will, which was probated on Saturday. Numerous bequests were made to charities. Upon the death of his widow, Mrs. McIntosh, the bulk of his vast legacies of \$5,000 are to be paid to St. James' Square Church, 60 per cent of the income to be paid for current expenses and 40 per cent for missions. A legacy of \$2,500 is left to the Presbyterian Church, \$2,500 to Knox College to establish a Maria McIntosh scholarship, \$2,000 to the Ontario Sick Children's Hospital in memory of Miss Euphemia Fenwick. Bequests of \$500 each are provided for the Muskoka Free Hospital, Weston Sanitarium, \$100 each for the Aged Men's Home, Aged Women's Home, Boys' Home, Honey Victoria's Home of Nurses, Ontario branch of the Dominion Alliance, St. Christopher House, Upper Canada Tract Society, Upper Canada Bible Society, and \$200 to the Royal Arthur Sallors' Institute to provide comforts for the McIntosh Room therein.

This will mean that many of our legislators will spend their first week after February 14 with very sore arms, as a vaccination certificate will be the only passport recognized by board of health officials of the sister province.
