NEW LIBERAL ORGAN
Monthly, Published at Ottawa, Plans Missionary Campaign—Will Appeal To All Citizens
Ottawa, Sept. 19—Canada's newest periodical was issued this week under the auspices of the Liberal party. It is called The Canadian Liberal Monthly, and its name indicates, it is a monthly magazine devoted to the exposition of Liberal principles and Liberal policy in general politics. The introductory article states that the magazine, while vigorously expressing the Liberal viewpoint on all the political issues of the day, will endeavor to appeal to every citizen irrespective of his political beliefs. The inaugural number contains a general article, reviewing the principles of Liberalism and the tendencies and characteristics of the Borden government. There are three cartoons and a number of short articles on current politics. The magazine will be placed on sale throughout Canada, and is published by the Central Liberal Information Office.
