

Managing Director. The Riordon Pulp & Paper Company, Limited, was formed of the Riordon Paper Mills, Limited (established 1859), and G. H. Perley & Co. (established 1899). The Company has 1,184 square miles of timber limits (valued at \$2,055,800) in the Province of Quebec on the Rouge River (a branch of the Ottawa River). The plants are located at Hawkesbury and Merritton, Ontario (pulp and paper), and Calumet, L'Annonciation and St. Faustine, Quebec (lumber). The total annual capacity is 37,500 tons sulphite pulp, 6,000 tons ground wood pulp, 6,000 tons paper and 15,000,000 feet lumber (B.M.)
