Eighteen in That State Out of 57 in Last Year.

Tuskegee, Ala., Jan. 8—The State of Texas led the nation in the number of lynchings during 1922, with Georgia second and Mississippi third, according to statistics made public here by the Tuskegee Normal and Industrial Institute.

Fifty-seven persons were lynched during the year, fifty-one negroes and six whites, seven less than the sixty-four for 1921. Thirten of the persons lynched were taken from jails and seventeen from officers of the law outside of jails.
